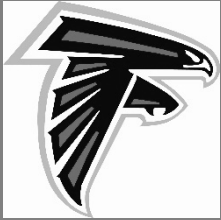

FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT, MR. ANDREW HAVELKA

Happy New Year! We are back and in full swing after the holidays. I hope everyone has had a great start to the year. Thank you for your patience and understanding over the last few weeks with the weather. There have been some difficult decisions made as to whether or not to have school, start late, or dismiss early. I was very impressed with how the Freeman community responded to the weather. Let's hope for an early spring!!

Here are a few important points to remember as we get back into the routine of school:

Changes to Freeman's Monthly Newsletter: If you are reading this, you have received the Freeman newsletter one way or another. If you would like a hard copy of the newsletter, please contact Vici in the main office and she will send you one.

Let's stay Healthy: Here are some key factors to staying healthy during this time of increased illness.

1. **Nutrition** - Drinking ½ of your body weight in ounces of water per day, eat lots of fruits and vegetables, healthy fats, protein and fiber and minimize your consumption of simple sugars
2. **Sleep** - Make sure you getting adequate sleep (7-9 hours for adults and 9-12 hours for children ages 6-12 and 8-10 hours for teens)
3. **Stress management** - Stress brings on illness as we generally don't take care of ourselves like we should---take time out to see a movie, go for a walk, sit quietly for a period of time, or do an activity that you enjoy to allow yourself to decompress
4. **Exercise** - 150 minutes per week for adults and 1 hour daily for children age 6-17
5. **Hygiene** - Wash your hands with soap and water for 30 seconds before eating and after toileting, throw away toothbrushes after you have been ill, keep your hands away from your eyes, mouth and nose, keep skin moisturized

Inclement Weather: There is an increased possibility for inclement weather this time of year. If school is closed or will begin late at 10:00AM, information will be left through the school phone system and on the school website. You may also get school closure information from the following media outlets: KWBE-AM (1450), KFOR-AM (1240), KOLN/KGIN TV (Channel 10/11) or KLKN (Channel 8).

ACT REQUIRED FOR JUNIORS

As part of the state assessment, juniors are now required to take the ACT through the school. Freeman juniors will be taking the ACT on April 7. Any juniors not in attendance that day will be required to take the ACT on April 21. There are no exceptions! This is an excellent opportunity for our students, to be able to take the ACT at no cost and have scores sent to the schools of their choice. While not all students plan to go to a university after high school graduation, the opportunity is available because they have taken this assessment.

ACT Information for Junior Parents!

Freeman juniors will be taking the ACT together on April 7th. All students in their *third year of high school* are required to take the ACT as the Nebraska state assessment. Freeman students will be meeting at the Adams Community building at 8:00 a.m. the morning of April 7th. Testing should finish around 1:00 pm and students will then be dismissed for the day. If a student is not present for testing on April 7th, that student will be required to make up the test on April 21st. The testing schedule will be the same on April 21st, however, the student will be required to return to school and finish the day in classes.

Students have the opportunity to fill out an interest survey and to have their test scores provided, for free, to four colleges/universities. However, students must have parent permission to do this. Without parental permission, scores are sent only to the student. You may request that scores be sent to a specific college at a later time, but there will be a fee you must pay. Please fill out the form below and send it to the school if you have not already done so.

Parent/Guardian Consent

Only students who have parental consent will be allowed to participate in the ACT EOS and provide test scores to colleges and universities. If you choose **not** to give consent, the student will not be allowed to request the four (4) free score reports to colleges/universities (valued at \$13 each) or participate in the EOS.

____ Yes, I give consent for my child to participate in the free EOS and request the score reports. Please note, the student will also need to say “Yes” in the answer folder to participate with EOS and provide college codes for score reports to be sent.

LOCAL CITIZEN VISITS 3RD GRADERS TO TALK ABOUT HISTORY OF ADAMS



Mr. Vernon Davidson recently visited the third grade social studies class at Freeman Elementary School. Mrs. Yates’s social studies class had been studying the changes that take place within a community as time passes. When asked if they had grandparents or great-grandparents living in Adams, Neely Latas, one of the third grade students, said that her grandparents did. She said that she thought her grandpa would be willing to come talk to the class.

Several weeks later, at the conclusion of the social studies unit about changing communities, Mrs. Yates contacted Neely’s grandfather, Mr. Davidson, to see if he’d be willing to come in for a classroom visit. He agreed. He shared with students the photos of what the village looked like many years before--some before he was born. He also told them about changes that he’s seen within the community in his many years of living here. The kids were very interested in asking Mr. Davidson questions. They asked about such things as, “What car did you drive?” and “What kinds of lunches did you eat at school?” They asked about stores and other buildings that used to be a part of the community but are no longer in Adams, as well as how the streets, homes, and businesses have changed.

FREEMAN SCIENCE CURRICULUM EXPLAINED



If you're like some parents I've spoken with recently, you may have noticed that your child's science curriculum has changed drastically since you were in school. Gone are the days of reading textbook chapters and sitting through countless days of lecture. Now, students are learning by doing. This involves exploring scientific phenomena by making observations, asking questions,

planning and carrying out investigations, analyzing data, and communicating ideas in scientific communities of their peers.

Like many districts in the state of Nebraska, Freeman has adopted the new standards for science called "Nebraska College and Career Ready Standards for Science" (NCCRS-S). In 2017, Nebraska adopted the NCCRS-S. These standards are based on the "[Framework for K-12 Science Education](#)" which was also the foundation for Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) standards adopted by many states. The Nebraska Department of Education's Vision for Science education is that "Nebraska's students demonstrate the scientific literacy necessary to be civic minded decision makers and demonstrate readiness for college, career, and lifelong learning. As critical consumers, students gather, analyze, and communicate information from multiple sources and make connections to their lived lives. Engaged in authentic and relevant learning experiences that cultivate a sense of wonder and curiosity, they make sense of phenomena and identify creative solutions to local and global problems."

Nebraska's vision for science education is achieved when each student has meaningful access to the educational resources they need at the right moment, at the right level, and with the right intensity supported by high quality instructional materials. High expectations for learning and student achievement are established for each student and carefully monitored over time. Students are encouraged to and allowed to discover and explore their passions and make meaningful connections within the context of their post-secondary interests.

The Framework, and NGSS, is changing the way we teach science. However, it can be tricky for those who haven't spent much time studying it. Within the NGSS, there are three distinct and equally important dimensions to learning science. These dimensions are combined to form each standard—or performance expectation—and each dimension works with the other two to help students build a cohesive understanding of science over time.

Crosscutting Concepts help students explore connections across the four domains of science, including Physical Science, Life Science, Earth and Space Science, and Engineering Design. When these concepts, such as "cause and effect" are made explicit for students, they can help students develop a coherent and scientifically-based view of the world around them.

Science and Engineering Practices describe what scientists do to investigate the natural world and what engineers do to design and build systems. The practices better explain and extend what is meant by "inquiry" in science and the range of cognitive, social, and physical practices that it requires. Students engage in practices to build, deepen, and apply their knowledge of core ideas and crosscutting concepts.

Disciplinary Core Ideas are the key ideas in science that have broad importance within or across multiple science or engineering disciplines. These core ideas build on each other as students' progress through grade levels and are grouped into the following four domains: Physical Science, Life Science, Earth and Space Science, and Engineering.

In 2017, Nebraska drafted a five-year [implementation plan](#). This plan allows for districts across the state to gradually align all grade levels to these new standards. Grades K, 3, 6, and 9 began in the 2018-2019 school year; grades 1, 4, 7, and 10 began the switch this school year; and grades 2, 5, 8 and 11 will begin next year. This spring, students in grades 5 and 8 will take a "field test" for their Science NSCAS, while next year grades 5 and 8 will be officially tested over the 2017 Standards. Juniors will continue to take the ACT as their State Science assessment.

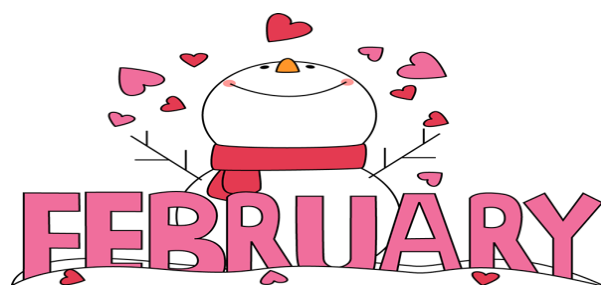
All meals come with one carton of milk. Extra milk may be purchased for \$0.35 each.
