Taylan Vetrovsky, Carter Ruse, and Eli Delhay collectively placed 6th in Sports and Entertainment Management. Max Latta also placed 6th in Intro to Business Concepts. Solomon Delhay placed in two other solo events: Intro to Financial Math, 6th, and Intro to Info Tech, 8th. Rebecca Ford placed 5th in Business Communications, and Summer Buss was awarded an Honorable Mention in Personal Finance.
